

The Destruction of the Temple Foretold



USPG Exhibition 'Choose Peace'

A new exhibition in London that reflects on what peace really means and how we all have a part in building it features four photographs of the Mission Society USPG which we support here in our church.

The pictures highlight the work that the Inglesia Filipina Independiente, IFI (Philippines Independent Church) are doing in the Philippines to advocate for peace and conflict transformation and for the rights of indigenous people to self-determination.

Bishop Carlo Morales is a peace advocate who was falsely imprisoned last year in the Philippines for 309 days. (centre of the photo in purple shirt). He was arrested on 11 May 2017 on the false charge of 'illegal possession of firearms and ammunitions', but in reality the bishop was jailed after refusing to leave the side of a human rights activist who had been wrongfully arrested by the police.

The arrests are part of a violent campaign by the authorities to destabilise the efforts of activists to win better conditions for

marginalised communities. In the Philippines there are intensified military operations in the countryside that displace thousands of national minorities, Bangsamoro, peasants, women and fisherfolk, and the persecution of activists tagged as terrorists.

The Christian church in the Philippines steadfastly calls on its people to stand firm in the struggle for justice and lasting peace,, and for the Philippines government to free all political prisoners and end the persecution of peace advocates.

The exhibition is at the Salvation Army International Headquarters: 101 Queen Victoria Street, London, EC4V 4EH near Mansion House tube station until Friday 7 December, with Free entry. Refreshments available to purchase in Café 101.
