


### Jesus Weeps

# Phoenix School Farm and Learning Zone

Have you ever visited the farm near the Janet Adegoke swimming pool on Bloemfontein Road?

It is a place for the

school and the local community groups. It offers volunteering opportunities for local residents. Comprising of glasshouses, polytunnels and a series of beds, fruit and vegetables of all description are produced together with medicinal herbs, plants to attract wildlife, and edible flowers. The site is also home to rabbits, bees and chickens as well as a wildlife pond.

Hammersmith Community Gardens Association assists with the management of the project with Phoenix High School. The acre of space alongside White City Estate provides opportunities for local resident to do some hands on gardening and very successfully—the farm continues to win awards each year. In addition to over 40 varieties of vegetable and herbs there is a community orchard, soft fruits and wildlife area.

There are three volunteer sessions each week. The annual harvest festival attracts over 500 people who were able to see a demonstration of apple pressing from Abundance London, try lots of farm related activities and pumpkin soup, chutney and apple cake all home grown. We now also run a 'Spring on the Farm' event in May which attracts over 500 people. The Farm Learning Zone is used by pupils from the school for lessons across the curriculum and some classes have dedicated beds. The project also acts as a hub for other local primary schools that visit on a weekly basis.

You can become a volunteer helper at the farm—next Wednesday 7th November from 10:00 am - 11:30 am and on 5th December 2018 there are new Volunteer Introduction sessions.
