## Today's Collect

Almighty God,

in Christ you make all things new: transform the poverty of our nature by the riches

## The Gospel according to John chapter 1 verses 29-42

The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him. John said, "Look, the Lamb of God.[a] He takes away the sins of the world! This is the One I was talking about. I said, 'A man will come after me, but he is greater than I am, because he was living before me.' Even I did not know who he was. But I came baptizing with water so that the people of Israel could know who he is."

Then John said, "I did not know who the Christ was. But God sent me to baptize with water. And God told me, 'You will see the Spirit come down and rest on a man. That man is the One who will baptize with the Holy Spirit." John said, "I saw the Spirit come down from heaven. The Spirit looked like a dove and rested on him. I have seen this happen. So I tell people: 'He is the Son of God."

#### The First Followers of Jesus

The next day John was there again with two of his followers. He saw Jesus walking by and said, "Look, the Lamb of God!"

The two followers heard John say this. So they followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him. He asked, "What do you want?"

They said, "Rabbi, where are you staying?" ("Rabbi" means "Teacher.")

Jesus answered, "Come with me and you will see." So the two men went with Jesus. They saw the place where Jesus was staying and stayed there with him that day. It was then about four o'clock.

These two men followed Jesus after they heard about him from John. One of the men was Andrew. He was Simon Peter's brother. The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother, Simon. He said to Simon, "We have found the Messiah." ("Messiah" means "Christ.") Then Andrew took Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked at Simon and said, "You are Simon son of John. You will be called Cephas." ("Cephas" means "Peter.")

# **World Council of Churches**

What is the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity?

Are you confused by all these names Catholic, Protestant, Pentecostal, Orthodox, Reformed, Baptist, Evangelical, and so on?

Well they are all different bits and pieces of the Christian Church, and they all fit together like a jigsaw, but sometimes the differences can seem to cause conflict and dissatisfaction. It might even look as if Christians are divided and that they argue amongst themselves.

At least once a year, Christians are reminded of Jesus' prayer for his disciples that "they may be one so that the world may believe" (see John's Gospel chapter17 verse 21). Hearts are touched and Christians come together to pray for their unity. Congregations and parishes all over the world exchange preachers or arrange special ecumenical celebrations and prayer services. The event that touches off this special experience is the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

Traditionally the week of prayer is celebrated between 18-25 January, between the feasts of St Peter and St Paul.

In order to prepare for the annual celebration, worship materials are used to help us pray throughout the world, and to search for the visible unity of the church.

## Here is a meditation and prayer for Christian Unity

#### Meditation

Christ is our light and our guide. Without the light and guidance of Christ, we become disorientated. When Christians lose sight of Christ, they grow fearful and divided from one another. Moreover many people of good will outside the Church are unable to see the light of Christ because in our Christian division we reflect Christ's light less clearly or, at times, block it out completely. As we seek the light of Christ, we are drawn closer to one another, and so mirror this light more clearly, becoming truly a sign of Christ, the light of the world.

### Praver

God, your word is a light to our steps and without you we are lost and disorientated. Enlighten us so that, through your word, we may walk your path. May our churches crave your guiding, consoling and transforming presence. Give us the honesty we need to recognize when we make it difficult for others to see your light, and the grace we need to share your light with others. We ask this in the name of your Son, who calls us, his followers, to be light to the world. Amen.
