The Upper Room—our Harvest charity

The Upper Room is in St Saviour's church, Wendell Park., offering support to the most disadvantaged individuals in West London. It was set up in 1990 with staff and volunteers, and support from Hammersmith & Fulham Council.

The Upper Room is a valued charity, assisting many of the most socially excluded people in our community. It feeds and supports more than 150 people a day and helps them become economically independent and gain employment, with the assistance of a network of local partner organisations.

Saint Luke—what do we know about him and his Gospel writings?

Saint Luke the Evangelist is celebrated on his feast day of 18th October.

Luke is one of the Four Evangelists—the four traditionally ascribed authors of the canonical Gospels. The Early Church Fathers ascribed to him authorship of both the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostless he is thought to have been both a physician and a disciple of Paul. Since the early years of the faith, Christians have regarded him as a saint. And a martyr.

The Christian Church venerates him as Saint Luke the Evangelist and as a patron saint of artists, physicians, bachelors, surgeons, students and butchers. In traditional paintings, portraits and church mosaics,

Saint Luke is often accompanied by an ox or bull, usually having wings.

Luke is the longest of the four gospels and the longest book in the New Testament; together with Acts of the Apostles the cornerstone of Luke–Acts' theology is "salvation history", the author's understanding that God's purpose is seen in the way he has acted, and will continue to act, in history. It divides the history of first-century Christianity into three stages, with the gospel making up the first two of these – the arrival among humankind of Jesus the Messiah, to fulfill "the Law and the Prophets", the period beginning with Genesis and ending with the appearance of John the Baptist second, the epoch of Jesus, in which the Kingdom of God was preached; and finally the



period of the Church, which began when the risen Christ was taken into Heaven, and would end with his second coming., which we live in today.

The most probable date for its composition is around AD 80–110, and there is evidence that it was still being revised well into the 2nd century.

St Luke's is a popular name for parish churches, such as our neighbours on the Uxbridge Road and in Chelsea. There are cathedrals named after St Luke in Maine (pictured, left) and Florida in the USA, and in New Zealand.
